Our Sheltered Workshop, Earthwise Industries, of Lincoln County, MO, has been in the same location since 1970. 1970! We've weathered the weather! We've had our ups and downs, our, "are you kidding me moments," our, "oh my goodness will we make it through these deficit moments." We've laughed, we've cried, yet through it all, we've never given up. Why not you ask? Because when we look out on the people we serve, their smiles, their contagious laughs, and their big personalities, we are humbled, and we simply are honored to serve them.

We have employees that have been with us as long as 40 years! Have you stuck with anything for 40 years? That's dedication! Other employment examples include 18, 25, 28, 2 years!

Are you moved yet? No, I haven't said what we do, I've yet to "move" you.

We serve the disabled population, the intellectually and physically disabled community. The people you typically don't see in the general workforce.

We provide them with jobs that are fun, creative, challenging, thought provoking, safe, but most of all, dignified. Jobs are brought in with much thought and consideration. We always make sure it best serves our employees before we sign a contract with a company.

What do we currently do? Long term has always been recycling cardboard and aluminum. We have employees that drive company trucks to contracted locations to pick up cardboard, bring it back, and bale it. We also have 8-10 bins outside our warehouse for the public to bring their clean cardboard, same with aluminum. We have 5 full-time recycling employees!

Inside our main warehouse, we have been awarded a dog treat fulfillment job, with Treat Planet out of Earth City. Labeling, heat-treating, counting, boxing, palletizing, etc. Treat Planet is known for their generosity in awarding fulfillment jobs to Sheltered Workshops!

We also process the donations that come into Budget Boutique – our non-profit, tax free, resale store. As the community brings in their clothing, books, household items, and furniture, our employees get busy deeming it sellable or not. It's a lot of fun for them, (and us!)

Now, back to 1970. If you were born during that year (before or close to it), or know someone who was, that puts you at 53 or older. Have you had "repair" needs in those years?...for example, house repairs...maybe the roof, hot water heater, HVAC, toilets, flooring, needed to be replaced? Most of you have, most of you may have wondered or stressed over HOW to pay for it, WHO was going to complete it, WHAT is going to fail next?? Surely it was a bit stressful, and anxiety is a dreadful feeling!

Here's the ask: Our warehouses need repairs. Plain and simple. We have very leaky roofs, interior panels that need to be replaced, flooring that has never been changed, employee bathrooms that still look and function like school bathrooms (very little privacy), a lunchroom that looks more like truck stop, equipment, plywood flooring in our resale shop that truly needs an update, uncovered storage that definitely needs protection from the weather, much needed fencing in several locations to fend off thieves, cameras for safety and identification....the list goes on and on.
